

"Unprecedented" seems to be the word that best describes the pandemic called COVID-19 we now face. Biblically speaking, that is not correct. The Bible records many such events that occurred all for the purpose of glorifying God and calling people to repentance. Even quarantining, social distancing, and stay-in-place orders are not new (see Leviticus). What is new is the fact that we are not reading about this phenomenon in God's Word, but we're experiencing it first-hand. The question we should all be asking is, "What is the purpose?" I would like to offer three purposes for what we are experiencing in our world and give three responses we should actively seek to fulfill:

PURPOSES:

- 1. **TO GLORIFY GOD**. In other words, this is His world and we should recognize His work in it always.
- 2. **TO REPENT**. That is, to know that you have given your life to Christ and to know your eternal destination is heaven.
- 3. **TO PREPARE:** Be ready, as Peter teaches, to give an account for the hope in you.

RESPONSES:

- 1. **GLORIFY GOD**. In all things give thanks. He has gotten your attention. You are focusing on Him. Read His Word, Pray, and Listen to His still, small voice.
- 2. **LIVE IN HOPE**: Knowing Christ as our Savior gives us hope that no matter what happens in this world, we are assured of eternal life, the New Heaven and New Earth where there in no more death, no more crying, no more pain, no more sorrow, and Praise God, no more viruses!
- 3. **SHARE**: share the Good New, that Jesus Saves with everyone you know and meet! Remember, Romans 1:16, "For I am not ashamed of the GOSPEL, for it is the POWER of God for salvation to EVERYONE who believes..."

Let me encourage you to be at peace today and watch God work in His world. Pray for His will to be accomplished on earth as it is in heaven.

Notes from Your MoM...



The Holmes Family has been laying low for the past few weeks and we are surviving. As is probably the case with most families, there are moments when we have had a little too much "family bonding time." Christopher (HGTC) and Gabriel (Winthrop), like other college students, are finishing their semester online, which has been challenging at times. Anne has been busy preparing packets for her Kensington Kindergartners and spending much time with parents by email. I have been busy taking care of a few cleaning out and cleaning up projects (no, I haven't gotten to my office—yet!). We try to ride bikes every day, which has been a fun activity for Anne, Gabriel, and me; Christopher likes to fish and go down to the Wedgefield boat landing when he can. However, I miss my FBC Family!! I miss worshipping with you, ministering among you, fellowshipping with you, and working with our choirs and musicians!

God is in control and His timing is perfect! While none of us likes this virus not the radical lifestyle change that has accompanied it, He has been so faithful and has worked out some wonderful blessings in my parents' lives. As many of you know, my Dad has dementia that is gradually getting worse. He turned 85 on February 3 and we planned a trip to Charlotte on the weekend of February 14 to celebrate. Much to our surprise, we walked in late that Friday night to find that my Dad could not sit up in a chair, get up out of the chair, or walk without assistance. My mother, brother, and I had to go to their mountain house on Saturday to get it ready to sell while Anne, Christopher, and Gabriel stayed to take care of Dad (much more than they had planned to do!). When we got home that Saturday evening, things had gone from bad to worse; we ended up having to call 911 and dad was admitted to the hospital for five days. It was divine providence that God allowed us to be there, then that he was able to get into a rehab facility (where he desperately needed to be) close to their house. Then, again in God's perfect timing, he was released to go home one day before the crackdown on facilities like the rehab hospital due to the coronavirus, which would Have been a nightmare for him and my Mom. He has done very well at home and has been blessed to get continued inhome therapy three times a week, even with the stay-at-home mandates. God is so good!

The other miraculous event in which God has shown His divine providence is the selling of my parents' mountain home. As some of you know, a year-plus of stress and time consumption ended last September with the sale of a warehouse that my parents have owned since my Dad retired in the Nineties. They bought this mountain home in 1990 and enjoyed spending the majority of the summer there for thirty years as well as weekends in the spring and fall. However, with Dad's declining condition, my brother and I knew that it was time for them to give it up; God allowed my mother to recognize this and we began discussions in the fall. The problem is, it needed much work and it is located between I-77 and the Blue Ridge Parkway (not much to do in the area) in a development where it has been extremely difficult to sell houses. A friend of a friend of my mother's called and said a man from Florida who was raised in the area had just bought a house in the neighborhood and was looking for a home to fix up as a guest house for family and friends to visit (yes, evidently he is very well-off!). God allowed us to sell the house without even having to put it on the market--no realtor, no inspection, no repairs—for just a little under the price we were going to ask! Once again, God's timing was perfect, as the closing took place the week that the coronavirus began to make its way into the United States. There is no telling how long my parents would have had to hold onto this house nor how much money they would have had to sink into if it had not sold when it did and in the way it did.

My friends, in the midst of all the chaos, GOD IS IN CONTROL and GOD IS GOOD!!
