n Saturday, February 22 my grandson, Wells Xavier Holly came into this world. Through the marvel of sonogram I got my first glance at him as he was chilling in his mother's womb. Now that he's home with his family, through the marvel of technology, I have seen even more clear pics and videos of him squirreling around the floor with his big sister Violet. Soon I'll have the opportunity to meet him face to face and tell him all about the new shotgun, box call, and fishing pole I've bought him (Don't tell Ann. It will be our little secret.) I think he will be just as excited about meeting his favorite Poppy as I am to meet my favorite grandson.

The arrival of Wells has reminded me of the greatest tragedy of modern ethics called abortion. To date over 61 million babies have been destroyed in their mother's wombs in the name of women's health care and pro-choice. As hard as it is to believe, now there is a push to normalize post-birth abortions. That means murdering a perfectly healthy baby that has been fully delivered but simply not wanted. We have reached a sickening nadir when we have lost compassion for the most vulnerable among us.

How do we turn the tide of this great moral injustice? One way is by learning how to effectively share the pro-life message with others with grace and truth. The minimum amount to be awarded to each approved applicant is \$1,000.00.




Applications are now being accepted for the Mary Atmar Johnson Scholarship through Tidelands Hospice Founda-

Notes from Your MoM...

Holy Week is just around the corner on April 5-12. This is the week from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday when we remember the last few days in the life of Christ, His agonizing death, His solemn burial, and His glorious resurrection. As our theme for the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions states, "It's All Abut the Gospel!" The events of this week are the central foundation of The Gospel ("Good News") and our Christian faith.

Holy Week @ FBC, Georgetown affords several special opportunities of worship to make this week more meaningful for you. We certainly hope you will take advantage of each and that you will invite others from the community to join us. Read on, mark these services on your calendar, plan to attend, and please help spread the word!

Palm Sunday, April 5: We will begin the day with a joyous service of worship at **10:15am** as we celebrate the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to begin the Passion Week.

Then at **6:00pm**, the Worship Choir will share a beautiful presentation of Easter Music entitled **The Hope of the Cross**. The songs and drama will take us through the events of that week, from that Triumphal Entry to the Last Supper, down the *Via Dolorosa* to Mount Calvary, to the burial in and the resurrection from the tomb, and finally to the glorious exaltation of Christ! This will be a special experience of worship that you will <u>not</u> want to miss!!

Maundy Wednesday, April 8: A dedicated group of men will present *The Living Lord's Supper,* written and directed by our own Jim Tippins, at 6:15pm. This moving drama is based on the timeless portrait by Leonardo da Vinci of Jesus and His disciples, *The Last Supper*. Each of the men will share his thoughts on the unique events of that intimate gathering, based upon Scripture and historical records. As part of this special time of worship, we will share Communion accompanied by special music of the season.

Easter Sunday, April 12: The week will culminate in the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ! This year, we are having just <u>one</u> Sunday morning worship service at our regular 10:15 AM time with Sunday School at 9:00 AM, The Worship Choir will lead, there will be traditional hymns & contemporary songs of praise, plus a powerful message from Pastor Ted. The cross and the sanctuary will be adorned with Easter lilies as we celebrate the miraculous event which sets Christianity apart from all other religions.

The Worship Choir, Instrumentalists, Drama Team, and Technical Crew will be very busy preparing for these services during the month of March; please pray for them!
