## Psalm 119:11 declares "Thy word have I hid in

my heart, that I might not sin against thee." Hiding God's Word in our hearts is a biblical imperative if we hope to pursue a holy life that honors our Lord. Furthermore, Psalm 119:105 reminds us, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." We have no clearer instruction regarding God's Will for our lives than the Holy Scriptures. As we follow their council they literally lead us on the path of righteousness.

We all would probably agree that scripture is of utmost importance and ought to be committed to memory; we might all also confess that we fall miserably short at taking the time and exercising the discipline to hide the sacred text in our hearts as we should. Believers in other countries where persecution has fallen upon the church have often reminded us that the only scripture we really have are the verses we have stored away in our hearts.

## The Church Is Never Closed

The year 2020 will be remembered for generations to come. The world has not experienced such loss, pain, illness, and confusion. We have had world wars, famines, and natural disasters; however, the COVID 19 Coronavirus pandemic hit the world's population equally and simultaneously. We've all been in this together. Sadly, politics as well has played a major role in this pandemic to the point of causing mass confusion, dysfunction, misinformation, and most importantly, an assault on our freedoms, particularly, freedom of worship.

Some states passed emergency rules barring churches from meeting while also imposing hefty fines for defying those rules. Some churches experienced closures out of fear among the members to gather for worship. Many of these churches will be permanently closed, sadly.

Making difficult decisions like closing the church in any season (weather emergencies, facility emergencies, etc.) is never easy. Every hurricane season, the Pastor, staff, and deacons agonize over when to close as precaution for the safety of all. While a storm passes relatively quickly, the coronavirus is still upon us. With the same regard for safety and wellbeing of our members and staff, the decision was made to close our church after being opened from May17th to December 13th without incident of illness of members attending services or Sunday school. While a few well-meaning folks were not in favor of closing, it must be stated that our decision to close was not out of fear, but love for our fellow members and guests. No less than 75 members were infected by the virus between Thanksgiving and the time the decision to close was made. Quarantining was the most important option for everyone connected to those infected. When you consider the number infected and the number of potential folks placed in quarantine, that was close to the number currently attending worship. The question became, who would be attending? The answer, very few. We had been averaging close to 300 in attendance. Once the word got out that many in our congregation were sick, that number dropped to nearly half. Given the number of those needing to quarantine it would leave relatively few to attend.

The past three weeks of closing proved prudent and wise. Members were able to stay home, get well, and not spread the virus further. Is it over? Not by a long shot! And that means we may face the decision to close again for the very same reason; love, not fear.

We are thankful for a pastor who prayerfully sought the Lord's wisdom along with the wise council of our Deacon body, staff, and others in this difficult decision. process. Important to note and consider through all of this is the fact that, the church has still gathered while scattered, much like what happened to the church of Peter's day. Both of his letters are written to the church scattered due to political uprising, persecution, as well as natural migration of people. His letters were written to reassure these new believers that the Lord was with them and they could live by faith that he would never leave them, not forsake them.

This pandemic has reminded us of two important points:

- 1. The church is alive and well and will not end until Christ calls us home in the Rapture where we will be FOREVER WITH THE LORD!
- 2. Christ has not forsaken the church; the church must not forsake Christ! When we reopen on January 17th, gather with us for worship. Our 9:00 service will now be **"Masks Required"** throughout the service. The 11:00 service will remain **"Mask Encouraged."** Sunday School will resume in March.


